- Activities Report:

Activities Committee held a New Year's Eve party December 31st at St George Episcopal with a turnout of around 100 or more guests where we watched the ball drop on one TV and the Buckeyes playoff game on another. We started with \$500 seed money and with the money brought in from 50/50, literature raffle, merchandise sales, donations and after all expenses paid and ordering some more t-shirts, we are returning \$496. We are planning a bowling event with a possible date of April 11th at beaverview bowling alley and trying to gear towards getting more treatment centers and newcomers to come. This will be a 3-hour event with costs being \$120 a lane that will hold six bowlers, each lane and that includes one pizza, a picture of pop, chips, and pretzels and we would like to rent what is called the 300 room for fellowshiping and that is where we could sell our merchandise and have the

food set up. We are looking at renting 10 lanes so that could accommodate 60 bowlers for two games or up to 120 bowlers for one game each depending on the turn out. Our plan is to sell tickets at the door for \$25 each but we are looking for advice on how we can gear this towards newcomers and treatment centers by offering a free ticket to them a discounted ticket to them, if we could have people sponsor them or donated their ticket price from other attics or if this has to be a flat rate for everybody on what our traditions allow us to do. We do not want to do pre-order tickets because we do not have a bank account that we could put cash app or venmo to and do not want to accept payment to our personal venmo or cash app and possibly be responsible for taxes at the end of the year. We are planning to offer this to all treatment centers with little to no cost to them but worried about the money that will come in because 10 lanes at a hundred and twenty dollars a lane and Rental of the 300 room comes out to \$1320. 50/50 is usually a good Revenue resource but if this is geared to newcomers and treatment center we hope to have a good turnout with them but doubt they will have much contributions if any to the 50/50, we will be selling merchandise, taking donations, and with the ticket sales at the door I would think we could bring in a decent amount of money back. Activities is approved for 5 events held a year, \$500 and event, \$2500 for thr year. I will be asking for the whole \$1,320 that this event will cost on the hope that we are able to return a decent amount of money back and that we have only spent \$4 on our budget for the year so far. We are looking for any advice on how to properly run this event. Activities Committee is not geared towards making money for the area but we are focused on bringing newcomers and people out of treatment to NA because it seems as most of the treatment centers in the Five Rivers area are mainly taking their clients to area AA meetings. We would like guidance from h&i to try to get more of us as attics or them as in H&l into these treatment centers and talk to the clients and the people that run the place along with the employees that give rides to the meetings to pass out our schedules and try to have them bring them to more NA meetings. I would like to use this event as opening the door to our fellowship for these newcomers that are in treatment and will have a decision on which Fellowship they would like to go to when they have the decision on their own

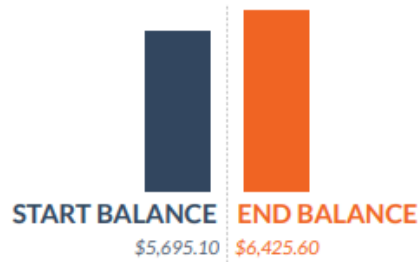
Treasurer Report:

I have not received any funds from Activities as of yet and I must move on with my report and managing the ASC bank account. I have also not received funds from the Literature chair for this month. ASC \$1780 Literature \$1700 The end of the quarter is approaching and we will discuss Regional donation at the March Area Business Meeting and will be ready to mail out a check. I am projecting a quarterly Regional donation of \$2,945.60.
